WICKER MEMORIAL PARK GENERATES NEARLY \$1 MILLION

Balmy temps, abundant sunshine and just the right amount of rain made 2015 one for the record books at Wicker Memorial Park.

Led by an increase in the number of golfers frequenting the links, the 226-acre park generated more than \$950,000 in revenue last year, second only to 2012.

Golf fees, carts and duffer-related concessions generated \$574,000 – nearly 60 percent of all revenues – while shelter rentals, the splash pad, special events and concessions added another \$381,000 to the bottom line.

“After many years of navigating unexpected costs because of weather and natural disasters, we are very close to break-even,” North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan said. “We are hoping 2016 is our breakthrough year.”

Activities, such as concerts, movies in the park and nonprofit walks, along with recreational pursuits that include the splash pad, sand volleyball, tennis courts, walking trails and a dog park, draw hundreds of thousands

visitors to the park each year.

“Wicker Memorial Park has been a haven for township residents for almost 90 years. We have seen growth in the number of people using the park every year,” Mrvan said.

“We want the park to pay for itself. Any profit will be used to create additional programs – concerts, senior and children’s activities – to improve the quality of life for residents. Golf is our financial anchor. It allows us to keep the Wicker Park course on par with others and continue upgrading facilities.” ▲

TOWNSHIP HELPS FLINT

When North Township officials learned of the water crisis in Flint, Michigan and that a group from East Chicago was assisting, they pitched in with a donation of their own – a pallet of water to help tide residents over until new pipes are installed.

“Flint is in desperate need of clean water. We were happy to help out, in whatever way we could,” North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan said. “The people of Flint are in need of the very basics, which they cannot provide for themselves.”

PARK TO UNVEIL NEW OUTDOOR FITNESS AREA THIS SUMMER

The next playground at Wicker Memorial Park is planned – for adults.

A concrete pad, which will be poured this spring on the west side of the park near the pavilion, will feature an open-air fitness area with an elliptical machine, leg press, rower bike, vertical press and pendulum.

The area will also include benches for resting and a bike rack for those who choose to pedal to the park. The fitness area is being developed to be handicapped-accessible wherever possible.

Fitness equipment that can handle the wear-and-tear of constant use – and the elements – is a relatively new concept.

Wicker Memorial Park Superintendent Brett Bierman said North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan was the brains behind the project.

“Frank had seen something similar at one of the parks in East Chicago and wanted to make it available to residents of the township,” Bierman said. “Our plan is to open the fitness area in July so people can exercise outdoors yet this summer.” ▲

The crest on the red-bellied woodpeckers shines a little brighter and squirrels have more pep in their steps when the park is transformed by the season. Join us this spring for a walk, a bike ride or a rest in one of the most peaceful places in the township.

NEW DOG PARK NOW OPEN!

The portion of the park dedicated to our four-legged friends is set to open by May 1. Improvements include dog fountains and benches along with an expanded venue that is sectioned so that your pup can always run on grass. New rules will mean a modest fee and proof that your dog is vaccinated. Register your dog at the Wicker Memorial Park picnic office.

WALKING & BIKING

The 2.5-mile trail that runs along the perimeter of the park is perfect for walking, running, biking – or event skates! The half-mile inner trail takes you on a scenic tour of the park, volleyball courts and playground. All trails are paved and open from dawn to dusk.

TENNIS & VOLLEYBALL COURTS

The park features five tennis courts and three sand volleyball pits for the community to enjoy. First come. First served.

SALUTING OUR VETERANS

There is a project afoot that will forever honor and remember the youngest soldiers buried at Oak Hill Cemetery.

Later this year, the lanes that meander through the cemetery will be named for 17 men – all of whom died before their 24th birthdays.

“While researching the histories of those who are interred here, I found there were a group of veterans who died so very young – one of the soldiers died in battle the day before World War II ended,” Cemetery Manager Kelly Vicari said. “I wanted to do something special to make sure these soldiers were always remembered for the sacrifices they made.”

Vicari has become a walking history lesson of those buried at Oak Hill. Her goal: to document veteran lives before their stories are lost to time. “It’s the very least I can do,” she said.

“We are still just in the beginning stages of this initiative and are planning to have plaques at each intersection with the name and a little bit about each of these soldiers.”

FLAG-RAISING CEREMONY
Oak Hill Cemetery will honor veterans with a flag-raising ceremony. More than 500 veteran graves will be decorated.

“Putting flags at the resting places of these brave men and women is an honor,” Cemetery Manager Kelly Vicari said. “The Girl and Boy Scouts have volunteered to help and we hope to see many people from the community, too.”

STATE BOARD OF ACCOUNTS COMPLETES NORTH TOWNSHIP AUDIT

The State Board of Accounts has concluded its 2015 audit of North Township.

As part of the audit process, the township has been given suggestions for tweaking processes to improve efficiency and reporting compliance.

“We have had our exit interview with SBOA auditors and are making the changes suggested by the state board to be in compliance with their

rules and regulations,” North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan said. “They spend a lot of time with us and it’s good to know what we are doing right – and where we need to make changes.”

New procedures already in place include:

- ✓ Increased fiscal controls to guarantee all monies collected by one person are verified by another.

- ✓ Surveillance cameras in all areas where money changes hands.

- ✓ Case-review processes to enhance compliance and guarantee residents receive the assistance to which they are entitled.

Mrvan is also working with the township board to have new policies and procedures, mandated by the SBOA’s new manual, in place by June 30.


