SENIOR AMBASSADORS

New township program to assist residents with complex issues

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan has a mission to expand township assistance to local seniors that will debut this fall.

North Township Concierge is a one-stop shop that connects seniors with the appropriate agency that can help them.

“I spend a great deal of time out and about in the township and our seniors have many questions, but really don’t know where to get answers,” Mrvan said. “We will have a dedicated phone number to reach a senior ambassador along with information on our website.”

To begin the program, North Township case managers will work as ambassadors. Additional township personnel will be included as demand increases.

“We have many seniors, who are very engaged with us day-to-day,” Mrvan said. “We get great turnouts at our monthly lunches and trips.”

NORTH TOWNSHIP CONCIERGE

This new program connects seniors to the appropriate agency that can help. North Township ambassadors will work to help seniors who have issues with:



- Consumer protection
- Wills
- Transportation
- Home-delivered meals
- Scam assistance
- Volunteer opportunities
- Elder abuse protection
- Property taxes

“I got the idea for this program after one of our lunches, where it seemed many of our seniors had questions and weren’t quite sure where to get the answers,” Mrvan said.

“North Township Concierge will bridge that gap and provide another level of safety.” ▲

NEW DOG PARK OPENS AT WICKER MEMORIAL PARK

A few sniffs followed by a healthy kick of the turf and the new dog park was open for business.

In its first two weeks, the playground for pooches attracted 35 dogs ranging from the long and lanky to tiny teacups all bent on kicking up their heels and enjoying the amenities, such as dog fountains, benches for the leash-holders and an abundant swath of green.

One of the best features of the new

Wicker Park Dog Park: a plan to preserve the verdant green turf.

“The problem we had with the last dog park was twofold: It was too small and the grass never had a chance to recover,” Wicker Park Superintendent Brett Bierman said. “We have the new park split in two. When one side gets beat up, we open the other side for dogs and let the weathered grass recover. This new park is a great improvement over the one we replaced.” ▲

WICKER PARK COMES ALIVE WITH NEW TREES

A grant from the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative is putting the green back into the Wicker Memorial Park golf course.

Already this spring, 80 poplar, tulip, birch, locust and cypress saplings have replaced some of the ash trees felled by the emerald ash borer. Another 40 fir, elm, oak and black gums are scheduled to be planted this fall.

It is a cycle that will continue as the park staff works to replace the 675 trees that fought a losing battle with the borer.

“The new trees stabilize the soil and reduce the flow of untreated water reaching the Little Calumet River,” Wicker Memorial Park Superintendent Brett Bierman said. “These saplings are hearty and will become a beautiful canopy again. It’s just going to take time.” ▲

EMERALD ASH BORER

The emerald ash borer kills ash trees by disrupting their conductive tissues, which means water and other nutrients can’t reach the highest levels of the tree and it begins to die.

First detected in Indiana in 2004, Munster began seeing large tracts of ash canopy destroyed by burgeoning populations of the marauding insect in established neighborhoods several years ago. Today, the emerald ash borer has wreaked havoc throughout North Township, killing thousands of mature ash trees.

WHAT’S NEXT?

Wicker Park crews will repeat the process, removing another 175 trees in the fall and winter and planting replacements in the spring.

LETTER FROM THE NORTH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE

“On-demand transportation isn’t temporary, township program needs permanent funding”

If you haven’t yet heard, our on-demand transit program is wildly successful with more trips than ever before and high satisfaction resulting from efficiencies we’ve built into the system.

If anyone had told me even two years ago that Dial-a-Ride would make more than 50,000 trips a year, I wouldn’t have believed them – but that’s exactly where we find ourselves today.

We knew there was a need. That demand is reinforced each month our trip numbers continue to grow.

A federal grant got us to where we are today. Unfortunately, Congestion Mitigation Air Quality funds provide limited-term grants – in the case of North Township, that money stops next year. The Regional Development Authority has also chipped in funds to help us keep pace with demand.

The problem: As grateful as I am for the grants we’ve secured, they are only a temporary fix to a permanent challenge. On-demand transportation isn’t a temporary condition.

The disabled, as well as those who no longer drive, will still need to get to the doctor or grocery store long after the last of the existing



grant dollars have been spent.

I am looking at options and talking to elected leaders to find permanent funding that will keep this vital transportation link humming for years to come.

Within the next 90 days, North Township will be adding an online portal that provides Dial-A-Ride information as well as links to all local mass transit options.

Please, enjoy your summer. Take advantage of our concerts, the opportunity to commune with nature at our very own Wicker Memorial Park or hit a round of golf on our links.

Stay tuned for exciting developments ahead.
